Dear Members of Unit 222,

The 2019 Annual Meeting and New Style Pairs event will be held at:

4 Aces Bridge Club 2315 W. Good Hope Road - Glendale Saturday, May 4, 2019

Bridge will start at 9:30 a.m. and will follow the format we have used in the past with the New Style Pairs Final or a Stratified Open Pairs (side) game. The Annual Meeting and awards ceremony will begin at approximately 1 p.m. The afternoon session, a second New Style Pairs Final and Stratified Open Pairs (side) game, will follow at approximately 2:30 p.m.

Qualifying games for the morning New Style Pairs event will be held at the local clubs; April 22nd – April 27th. The afternoon New Style Pairs event qualifying games will be held April 29th – May 3rd. They are listed in the 2019 Unit Calendar as Progressive Pairs Qualifying. Just a reminder, that if you do not qualify for the New Style Events there is always a side game.

Bridge will cost \$8 per session and you can play in one or both sessions. Entry fees will be collected on May 4th.

Players may bring their own lunch, go out on their own, or partake in a subsidized box lunch. A box lunch catered by CASH AND CARRY CATERING will be offered at a cost of \$5 per person. The balance will be subsidized by the Unit. Sandwich choices will be turkey, ham or chicken salad and includes a side of coleslaw, pasta salad and a fruit cup. Coke, diet coke or diet sprite soda is also included. Orders will be taken before the first session on May 4th.


Thanks also to Michael Fehrenbach for his hard work as our Swiss Team caddy.

Thanks to Peter Wilke and Ron Gould who helped with room setup and all those who helped on the last day putting away tables and supplies.



She was very active person and we enjoyed our conversations with her.
